## USGBC-STL Program: August 11 on ASHRAE Standard 189

**Join USGBC-STL and the St. Louis Chapter of ASHRAE to learn more about Standard 189.**

Standard 189 is being developed by the American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers in conjunction with the Illuminating Engineering Society of North America (IESNA) and the U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC). As the first such green building standard in the United States, it aims to establish minimum green building requirements in building code format for possible adoption by various code enforcement agencies.

Our program speaker, Mr. Lee Burgett, P.E., was ASHRAE President for 2005-2006. Since his retirement from Trane Company, Mr. Burgett has served as a consultant to Trane and others. He currently serves as a member of the Standard 189.1 development committee.

## New LEED Credentialing Maintenance Launched Monday, August 3

The Green Building Certification Institute (GBCI) is the sister organization of USGBC that oversees the LEED certification of buildings as well as the new LEED Professional Credentialing program (also known as LEED AP). GBCI launched the much anticipated LEED Credentialing Maintenance Program (CMP) on Monday, August 3.

The CMP is meant to enhance the value of the LEED AP credential to credential holders, their employers, and the industry. The CMP ensures that the LEED professional credentials signify present expertise as well as an ongoing commitment to maintaining knowledge of current green building practice and LEED rating systems.

New candidates for the LEED professional credentials will enroll in the CMP when applying for the exam.

LEED APs without specialty will have an enrollment window, a 2-year period between fall 2009 and fall 2011 in which they may choose to upgrade their current credential by agreeing to the terms and conditions of the (CMP). On August 3, GBCI began contacting LEED APs without specialty to announce enrollment windows, which are which are alphabetically driven.

LEED APs without specialty have three options in the new CMP:

**Option 1:** Become a LEED AP with one (or more) of the BD+C, Homes, ID+C, ND, or O+M specialty designations by passing one of the new specialty exams.

**Option 2:** Become a LEED AP with one (or more) of the BD+C, ID+C, or O+M specialty designations by completing the prescriptive CMP requirements for the initial 2-year reporting period.

**Option 3:** Do nothing and continue to be a LEED AP without a specialty in the LEED Professional Directory.
